# **Camp Loud Thunder Rules**

- 1) All units must check in/out with Ranger or Campmaster upon arrival/departure at camp.
- 2) Youth Protection Guidelines and Two Deep Leadership are enforced.
- 3) Advise the Ranger or Campmaster of any changes in your plans or departure times.
- 4) Alcohol, Fireworks, Firearms, and Smoking are not permitted on Camp property.
- 5) Motor vehicles are permitted in parking lots only. Plan to pack gear in and out of campsites.
- 6) Leaders should have a copy of the Guide to Safe Scouting and provide age—appropriate and approved Scouting activities.
- 7) Fires are allowed in the fire rings provided. Dead and downed wood is available to gather. Ranger approval is needed for cutting of trees. The firewood in sheds near the winter cabins is for cabin use only. Please make sure all unattended fires have been extinguished.
- 8) Latrines are provided for camp use. Only human waste should go in the latrines. Garbage facilities are located near the Dining Hall.
- 9) Pets are not allowed at camp. Only service dogs are permitted.
- 10) All accidents or incidents must be reported to the Ranger or Campmaster immediately. You will be responsible for any damaged property or equipment.
- 11) A credit card phone and phone number list with directions to the nearest hospital is located on the porch of the Administration building.
- 12) This is a Boy Scout Camp for our youth. The Scout Oath, Law, and Outdoor Code should always be a part of any activity at camp. Service projects are done at camp to help teach Scouts about volunteering and make a big difference in our facility. Ask the Ranger how you can 'Do Your Good Deed' while staying at Loud Thunder. Your help is appreciated.
