
Fall Field Day:

Training Validation

With every adult leader requiring Youth Protection Training to be updated by the end of 2010, (registered adult leaders without Youth Protection training will be dropped from charters); I am sure many people are asking, "How do we know if our leaders are trained or not?"

We are glad you asked. If youlog into your Myscouting.org account, and you look under the Training section, you will see a link for

Training Validation. Clicking this will pull open a search box that will allow you to search for any adult leader in Scouting, provided you have the information asked to search by. This will tell you what training this adult leader has accomplished and has recorded under their record. It will even pull up the online training for someone who has not yet received their membership ID card/number from the Scout Office. This is a great utility for Leaders

to be able to check and make sure their adult leaders in their units have their required training for their position. If you have further questions, please contact
