BSA Troop 29 is excited to present this year's Eagle Scout **Plus!** merit badge clinic. Participants will work on all of the badges offered, including two Eagle Scout required badges! This year's clinic includes:

- 1) Electricity
- 2) Personal Management
- 3) Citizenship in the Nation
- 4) Animal Science (includes a bus trip to a local dairy farm and a vet visit)
- 5) Forestry (includes a bus trip to the Sawmill Museum in Clinton)
- 6) Programming
- 7) Photography

Acceptance will also be on a first-come-first-served basis. Scouts wishing to be placed with a 'buddy' should indicate so on the registration form. Every attempt will be made to place these Scouts together. However, as each session will have a limited number of Scouts, placement with 'buddies' cannot be guaranteed.

Lunch will be provided. Scouts should bring their own drinks each day. Drinks should be clearly labeled with the Scout's name. Scouts should also plan to bring their own balls/recreational items for down time. They will NOT be provided this year.

Participants may bring water bottles (only) to carry with them throughout the day. Appropriate walking shoes and weather-appropriate attire should be worn as some merit badges require walking to other locations. Scouts should bring a notebook for note-taking.

Class A uniforms should be worn each day. However, Class B uniforms can be worn under the Class A uniforms so that the Class A can be removed if wanted or necessary. Class A's will be worn in public at all times.

POLICIES:

Scouts may not be dropped off prior to 8:15 a.m. and must be picked up by 3:45 p.m. Please enter the parking lot off of 6th Avenue and exit onto 4th Street when dropping off/picking up scouts. Do not use the alley (for safety reasons).

Scouts may not leave the premises except for arranged merit badge requirements. Failure to remain on the premises may result in expulsion.

Medications must be provided to the clinic director(s) in original containers, clearly labeled with the Scout's name and dosage.

Scouts who continually disrupt class will be expelled at the discretion of the clinic director(s) and no refunds will be made. Parents: If your child has behavioral issues that may otherwise be construed as "disruptive" please inform us ahead of time.

We ask that children who are on medication for ADD or ADHD continue their medication during the clinic so they may be able to focus and allow their neighbors to focus as well.

Neither BSA Troop 29 nor the Merit Badge Clinic director(s) will be responsible for transportation, other than what has been arranged for merit badge requirements. Parents are responsible for arranging for drop-off/pick up of their children. If parents have a particular security issue, they should contact the clinic director(s) as listed below.

Blue cards will **NOT** be provided. Instead, a certificate of completion will be issued. However, if your Scoutmaster requires a blue card, you may provide them and we will fill them out.
