
Thank You!!!

Some troops/patrols have a shakedown weekend or a dry run of the events to make sure that the boys know what to do before they get there, just like we try to do before all Boy Scout events. Every Scout should know how to start a fire without matches (hint) and handle wood tools safely (another hint), and know the principals of Leave No Trace (last hint).
